## **Director's Note**

Welcome to today's performance of *As The Seasons Turn*. It is a pleasure to have you join us for this devised community performance created by the Scottish Opera Young Company. Our current cohort of young performers came together at the beginning of autumn to collaboratively create an original piece from familiar choruses from classical and folk repertoires.

Scottish Opera Young Company remains the only place in Scotland for singers aged 17-21 to explore opera making. We are committed to championing new works as well as existing repertoire, and *As The Seasons Turn* combines both into an hour-long programme. The flexibility fostered by devising –creating a performance collaboratively rather than from a script – is key for developing a well-rounded artist prepared for today's opera performance practices.

Devised by the company, *As The Seasons Turn* takes place over the course of a day, of a year, and of a lifetime. While the show follows the life of Jane, our main character, from birth to death, each piece is a stand-alone episode that highlights the various joys and challenges all of us face across different stages of our lives. Starting and ending at midnight on New Year's Eve, we are taken on Jane's journey across the clock, the seasons, and her life – from a spring morning gaining independence learning to walk, a hot summer afternoon spent at her school fête, to a delightful evening with her old flame at a winter ball.

We wanted to create a show that connects us all through nostalgia and joy, making the familiar marvellous by celebrating everyday defining moments that we all face across our lives.

We hope you enjoy an hour of beautiful music and the immense talents and storytelling creativity of the Scottish Opera Young Company.
