Hours: Variable, including evenings and weekends, depending on the production schedule. Touring within Scotland will also be required.

Responsibilities:

- Supervise and care for our young performers during rehearsals, performances and while on tour
- Ensure the young performers safety, supporting and promoting their well-being at all times
- Stay overnight to accompany young performers when on tour away from their parents/ guardians, as required
- Ensure the young performers are provided with refreshments and meals during breaks as required and when on tour
- Assist with sign-in and sign-out procedures
- Complete daily record sheets
- Provide supportive, supervised environment for young people to continue school work where required during tour periods away from school
- Liaise with production staff, parents/guardians, and stage management
- Adhere to child protection policies and safeguarding regulations at all times
- Ensure correct breaks are being followed

- Be able to judge when a young performer is not well enough to rehearse/perform or is too tired to concentrate and take appropriate action
- Maintain a positive and professional environment for the young performers at all times

- PVG (Protecting Vulnerable Groups) Scheme membership or willingness to apply
- Strong communication and organisational skills
- Ability to work as part of a team in a fast-paced environment
